		The request for a zebra crossing requires approval by Transport for NSW (TfNSW).	
		A reduced speed limit also requires approval by TfNSW however the traffic flow studies and the adjacent land use does not support a 40 km limit at present.	
		Council will complete a pedestrian count at the site in the next couple of weeks.	
		Council can consider some minor works at the site to improve accessibility such as replacement of the signage (on the northern approach), installation of tactile ground surface indicators (TGSI's) on the pram ramps dependent upon the surface conditions (which were constructed prior to 2011) and painting of the concrete blisters.	
5.2	Orlando Street Crossing – Lyndal Bosman, Guide Dogs	Need for improvements regarding inclusion for people with vision impairments at the Orlando Street Crossing site – painting of the concrete blisters and TGSIs would be a significant improvement.	Council
